The Second Lesson James 3: 1-12

Lay Reader A reading from The letter of James...

Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, but no one can tame the tongue — a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh...The Word of the Lord...

Gospel Reading Mark 8: 27-38

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they answered him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him. Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. Leader	Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;
People	Hear us, O Lord of life.
Leader	You are the Lord who does wonders:
People	You have declared your power among the peoples.
Leader	With you, O Lord, is the well of life:
People	And in your light we see light.
Leader	Hear us, O Lord of life:
People	Heal us, and make us whole.

What is Taizé Prayer?

Taizé Prayer is evening prayer. It is a meditative form of worship, that uses meditative songs; prayer, both silent and intercessory; and scripture readings to help us focus on Christ's presence within us, and all around us. The service takes place in a candle-lit environment that helps calm us from the anxieties of the day, so that we can come before God and rest in the presence of the Almighty.



Taizé Prayer is evening prayer for all Christian faiths, and helps to remind us that God is larger than our denominational differences. In Taizé Prayer, we can settle into God's presence as believers of all faiths, who seek to hear from God. As we pray silently, or as we offer intercessions for the church, the world, and our neighbors, we begin to realize that we are all one family in God, and that all of us are welcome in God's presence. Scripture readings allow us to contemplate God's word, and to be shaped by that Truth. The service at St. Alban's is structured to be free flowing. While the service officially begins at 6:00pm, you may arrive at any time. Please enter the church in silence. If you need to leave before the service wraps up, please leave in silence, so those that remain may continue in prayer.

Taizé Prayer is named for the ecumenical Christian community formed in Taizé, France during World War II. Today the Taizé community includes brothers from all Christian denominations, including Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox traditions.
