### **The Second Lesson Acts 2:1-21**

Lay Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles...

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs — in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the LORD's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

### **Gospel John 7:37-39**

Deacon The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

### The Nicene Creed

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

*Deacon:* For the town of Wickenburg, for every city and community, and for those who live in them, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For healing, justice, and reconciliation between Native American people and the people of this Diocese, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For the good earth which God has given us, and for the wisdom and will to conserve it, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For an end to prejudice throughout our country and the world; that we will respect all people as precious children of God; and that all forms of discrimination and oppression will be forever banished from our hearts, our society, and our laws.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For the aged and infirm, for the widowed and orphans, and for the sick and the suffering, especially Bob, Deb, Carrie, Claudia C, Edith, Fred, Jim, Pink, Francoise, Diane, Don, Patricia, Tobie, Hartley, Sandy, Zachary, Bridgette, Randy S, Kay P, Cheri, Ellie, and Fr. Mike \_\_\_\_\_ *(people may add the names of the sick)*, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For the poor and the oppressed, for the unemployed and the destitute, for prisoners and captives, and for all who remember and care for them, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* For all who have died in the hope of the resurrection, and for all the departed, especially \_\_\_\_\_ (*people may remember those who have died*), let us pray to the Lord,

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* That we may end our lives in faith and hope, without suffering and without reproach, let us pray to the Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* Defend us, deliver us, and in your compassion protect us, O Lord, by your grace.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Deacon:* In the communion of St. Alban, and of all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life, to Christ our God.

*People:* **To you, O Lord our God.**

*A period of silence follows. The Presider adds a concluding collect.*

Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, "Peace I give to you; my own peace I leave with you:" Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give to us the peace and unity of that heavenly City, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit, you live and reign, now and forever. **Amen.**

*Presider* Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation; through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made: it will become for us the bread of life.

*People* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*Presider* Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation; through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands; it will become the cup of our salvation.

*People* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*(The acolyte receives the offering plate and the presider says the following prayer.)*

*Presider* Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation; through your goodness we present to you these tithes and offerings, which out of your abundance you have given to us. May we see them as our sacrifice to you, filled with hope and possibility for the work of the church and the furthering of your kingdom.

*(The presider offers the following prayer.)*

*Presider* Pray, my siblings, that my sacrifice, and yours, may be acceptable to Almighty God.

*People* **May the Lord receive this sacrifice at your hands to the praise and glory of God's name, to our benefit, and to that of all God's holy church.**

*(The presider continues)*

*Presider* The Lord be with you.  
**People** **And also with you.**  
*Presider* Lift up your hearts.  
**All** **We lift them to the Lord.**  
*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**All** **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. In fulfillment of his true promise, the Holy Spirit came down on this day from heaven, lighting upon the disciples, to teach them and to lead them into all truth; uniting peoples of many tongues in the confession of one faith, and giving to your Church the power to serve you as a royal priesthood, and to preach the Gospel to all nations. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker and of all.

Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died.**  
**Christ is risen.**  
**Christ will come again.**

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Almighty God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*(At the conclusion of the Eucharistic prayers, the Great AMEN, all people bow.)*

### COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

*Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey of faith, you are welcome to receive the bread and wine of Christ's Body and Blood. The wine will be offered by intinction, which means that you may dip the wafer into the small cup offered by the Deacon. Please do not put your fingers into the wine. If you do not wish to receive the wine, just receive the wafer and return to your seat. The Church teaches that you receive the full Christ in either the bread or wine. There is no requirement to receive both. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.*

*Presider* The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven.

**Communicant** Amen.

*Deacon* The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.

**Communicant** Amen.

*Presider* Let us pray.

**All** Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.
